Victor reads at Lilian the Librarian's lavender desk.



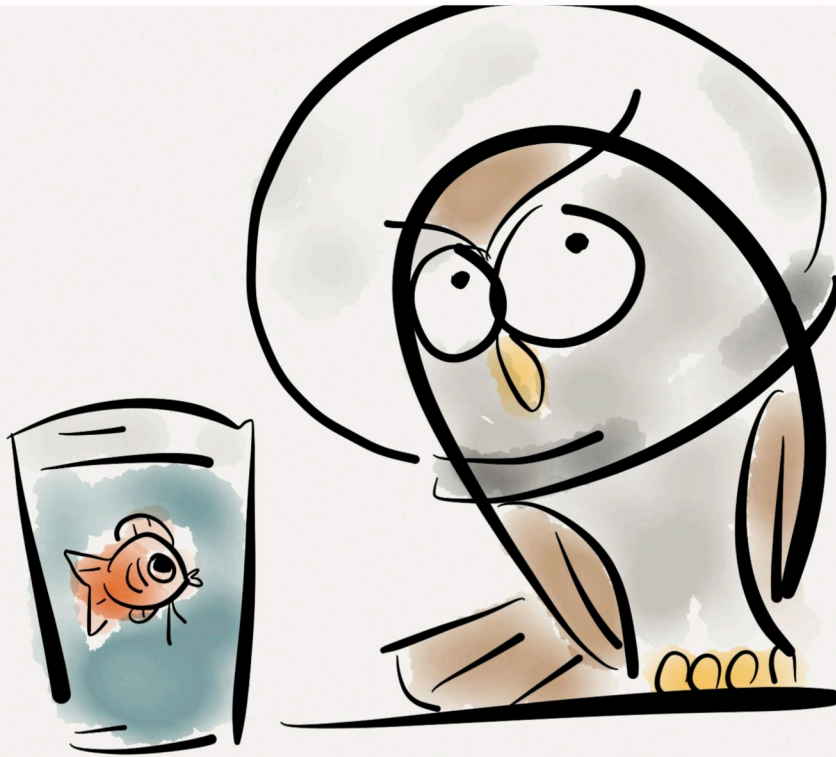
Springtime means the rabbits bring the cupcakes.



He flew all night and when the sun rose he'd find a little island and sleep under a palm tree until the sun went down.



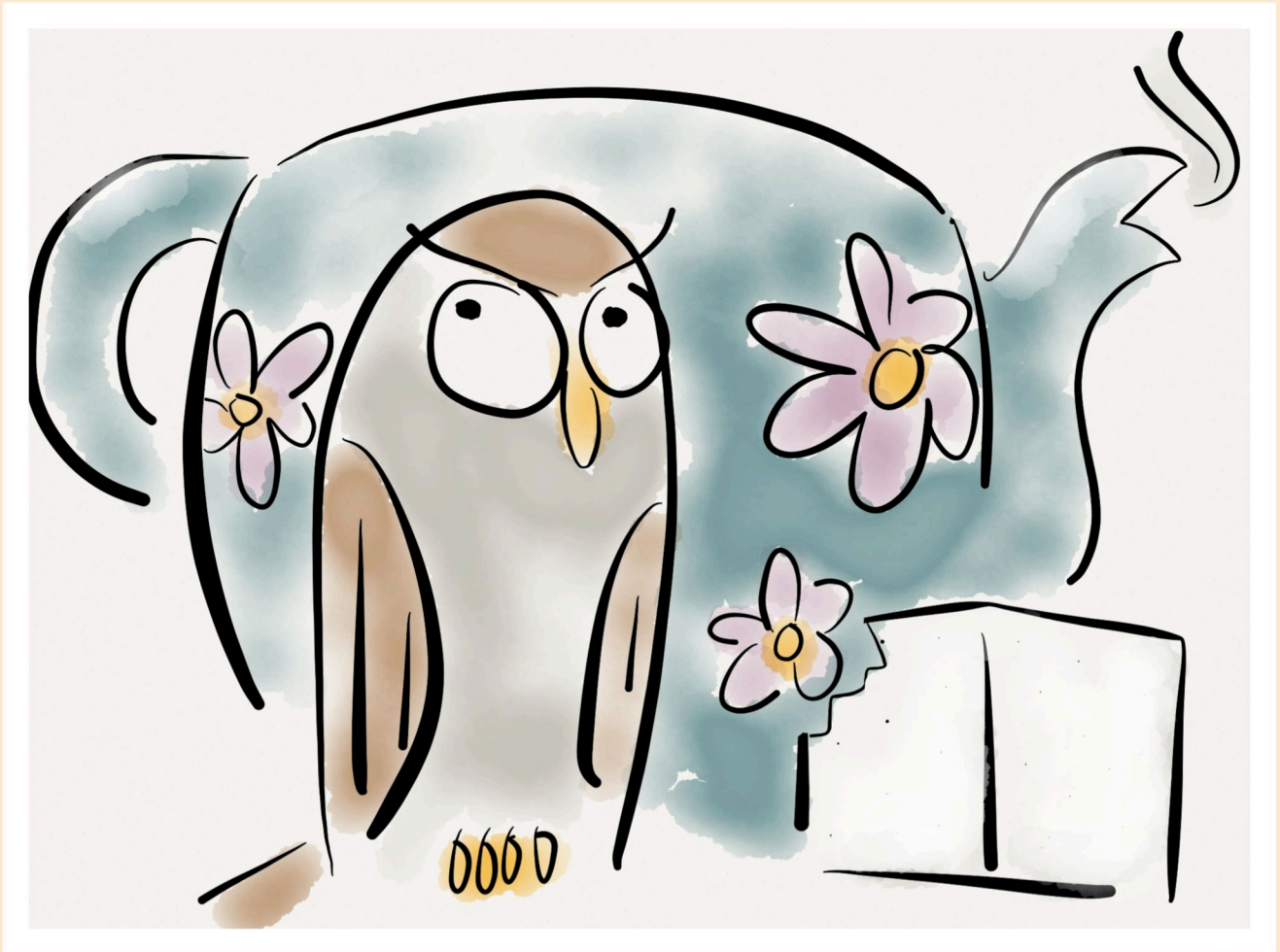
Victor loved tea because it kept his little feet warm.



Victor needed a space helmet so he borrowed the fish bowl.



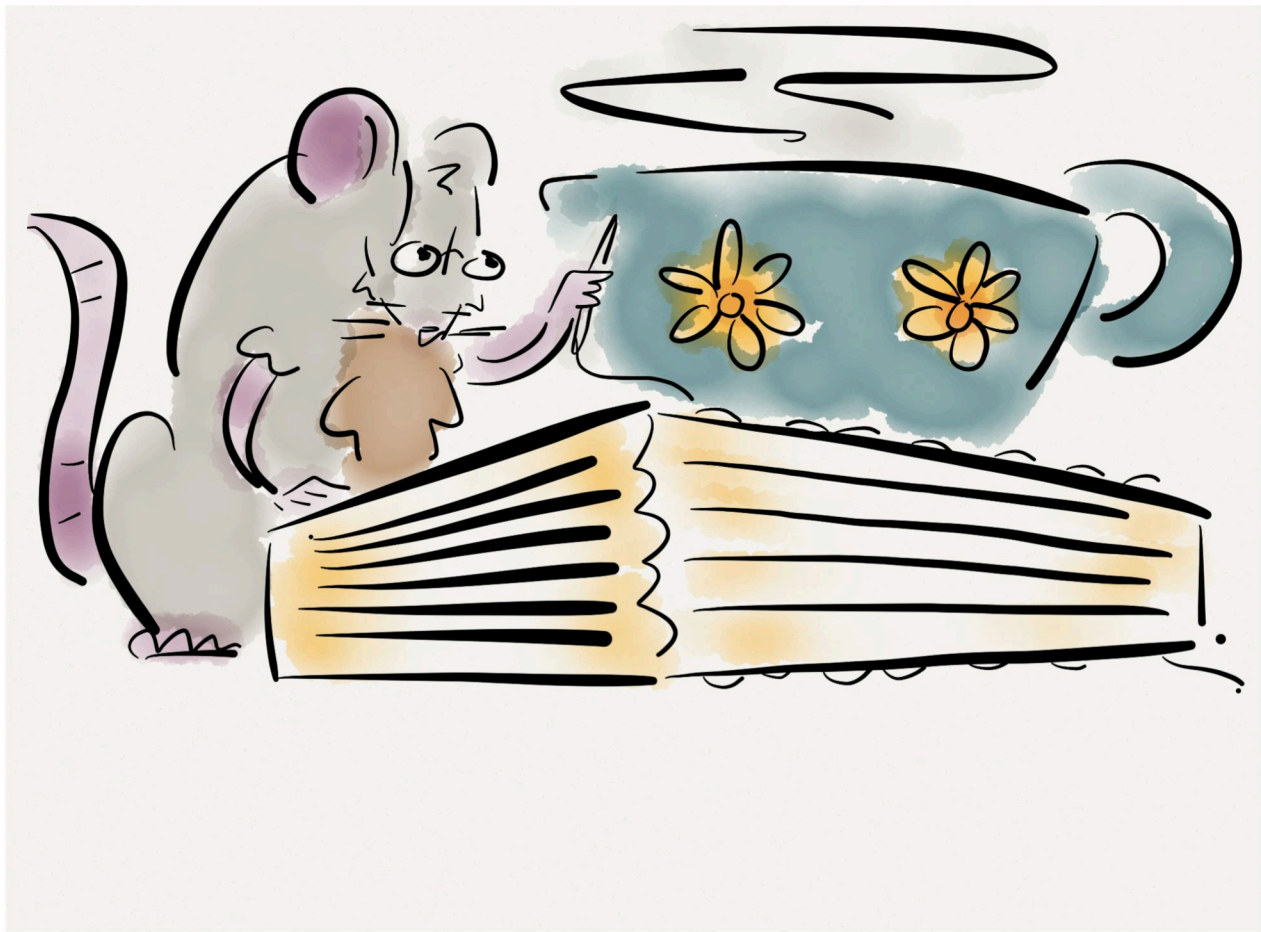
The tiny teacup elephant.



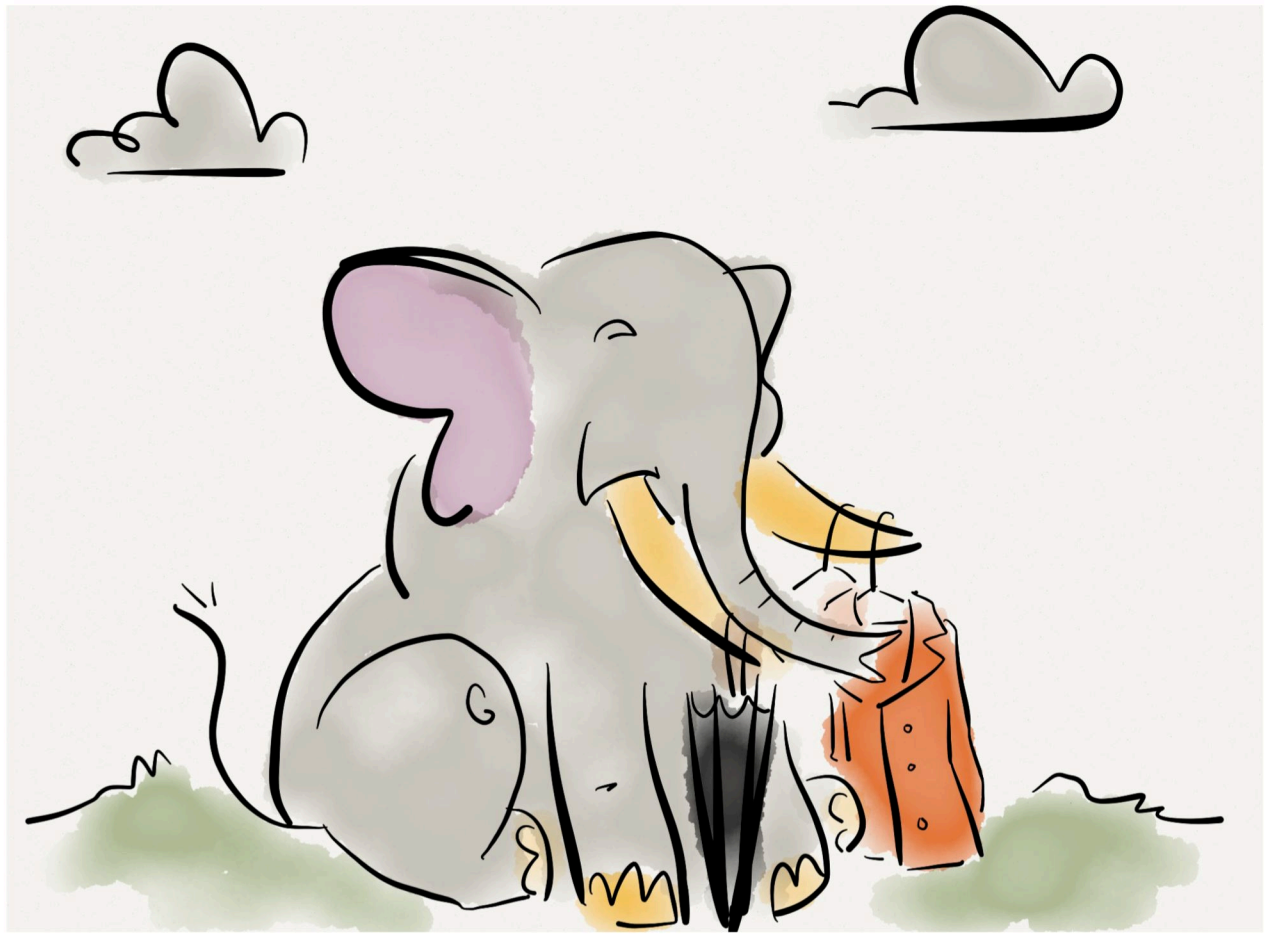
Victor hoped that no one would notice he'd taken a bite out of the sugar cube.



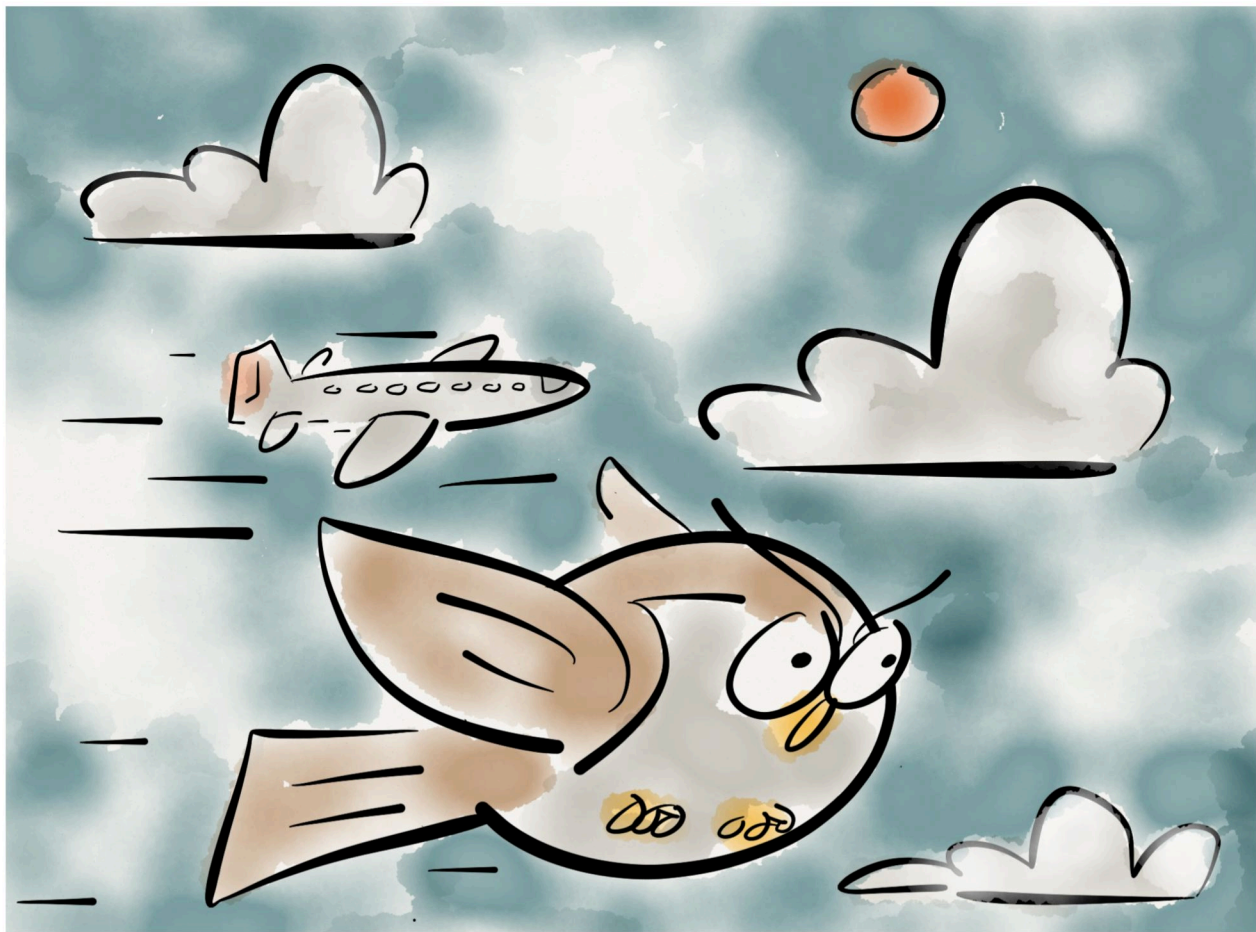
Giraffes would be good librarians because they could reach all the books on the top shelves.



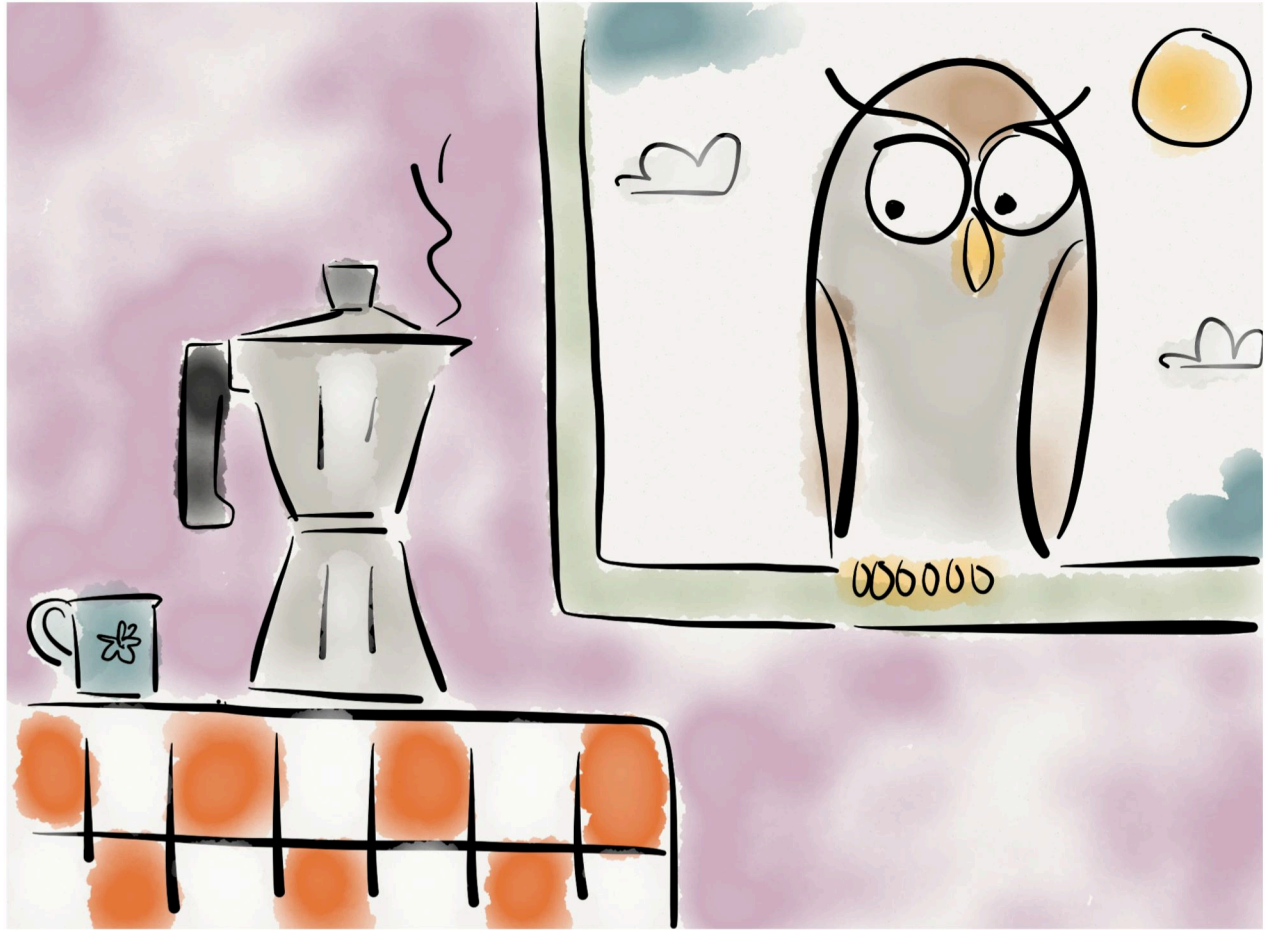
Mice are very good at repairing books because they have such tiny hands.

Elephants make good friends because they never forget your birthday.



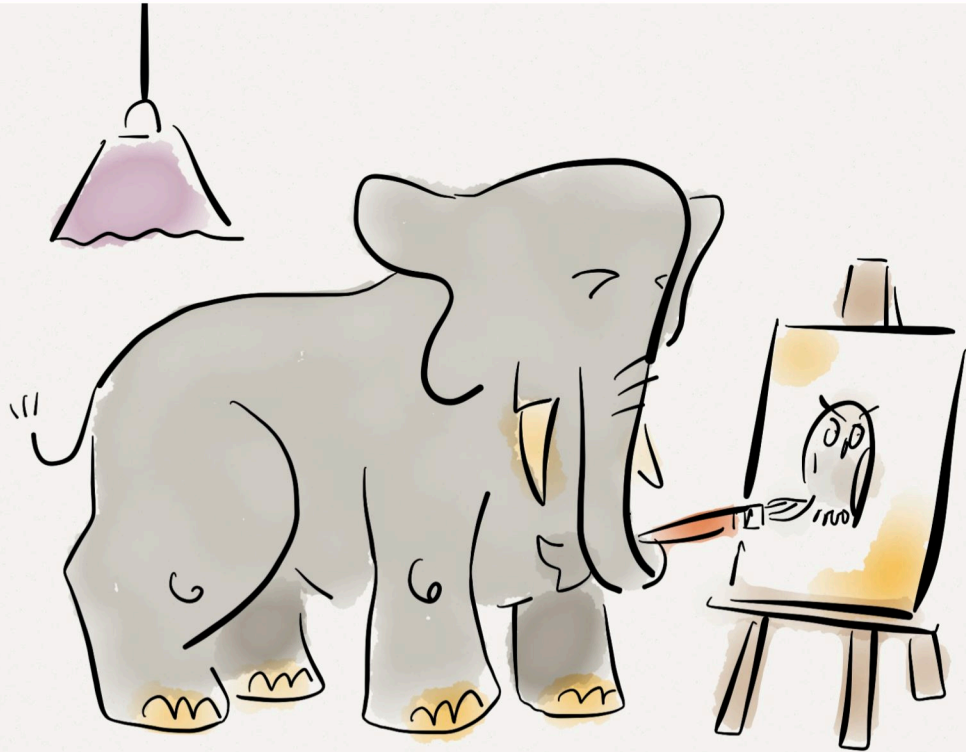
Since finding the umbrella Michelle discovered that she could read in the rain.



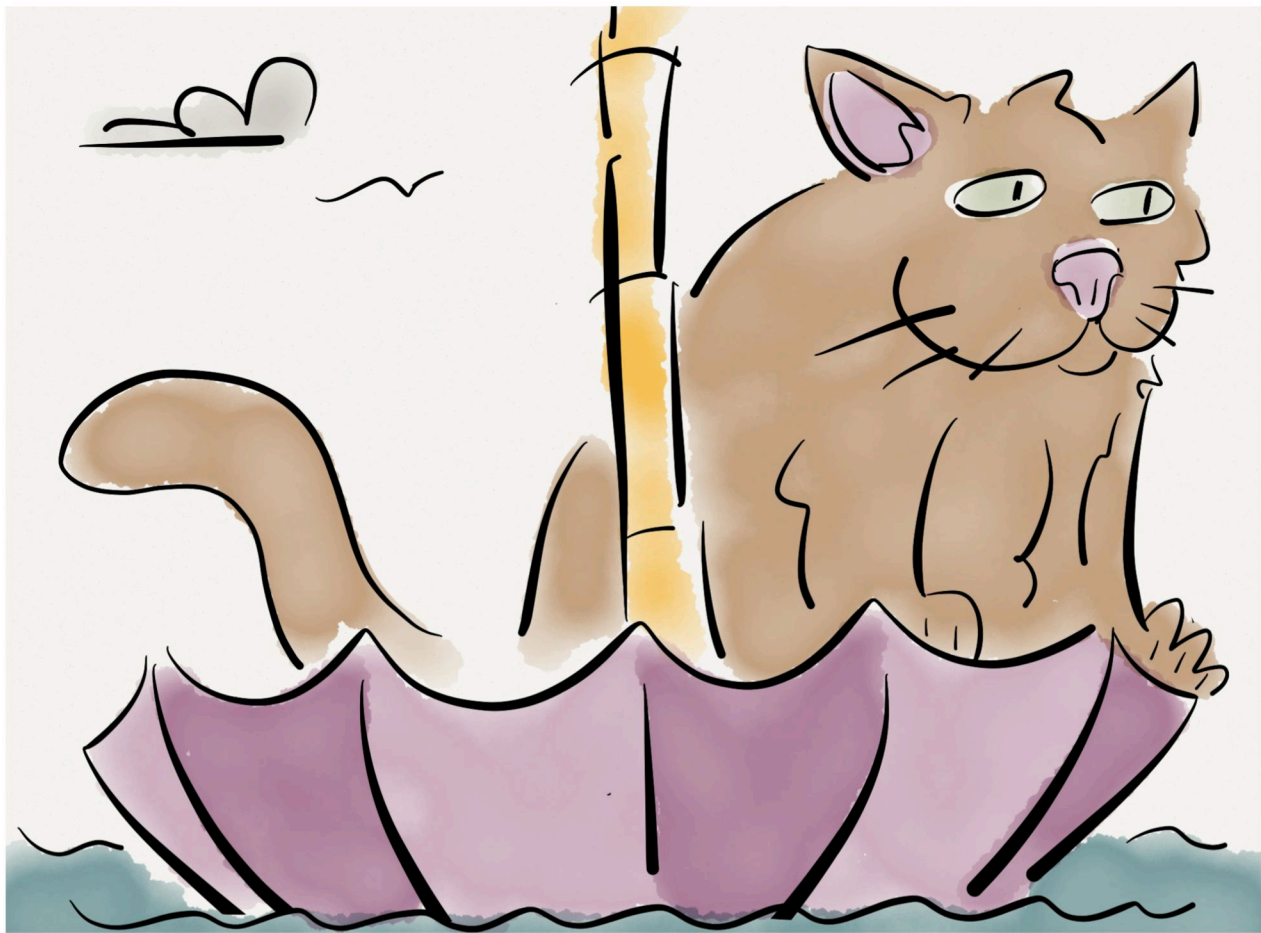
Victor wondered how lamps work.



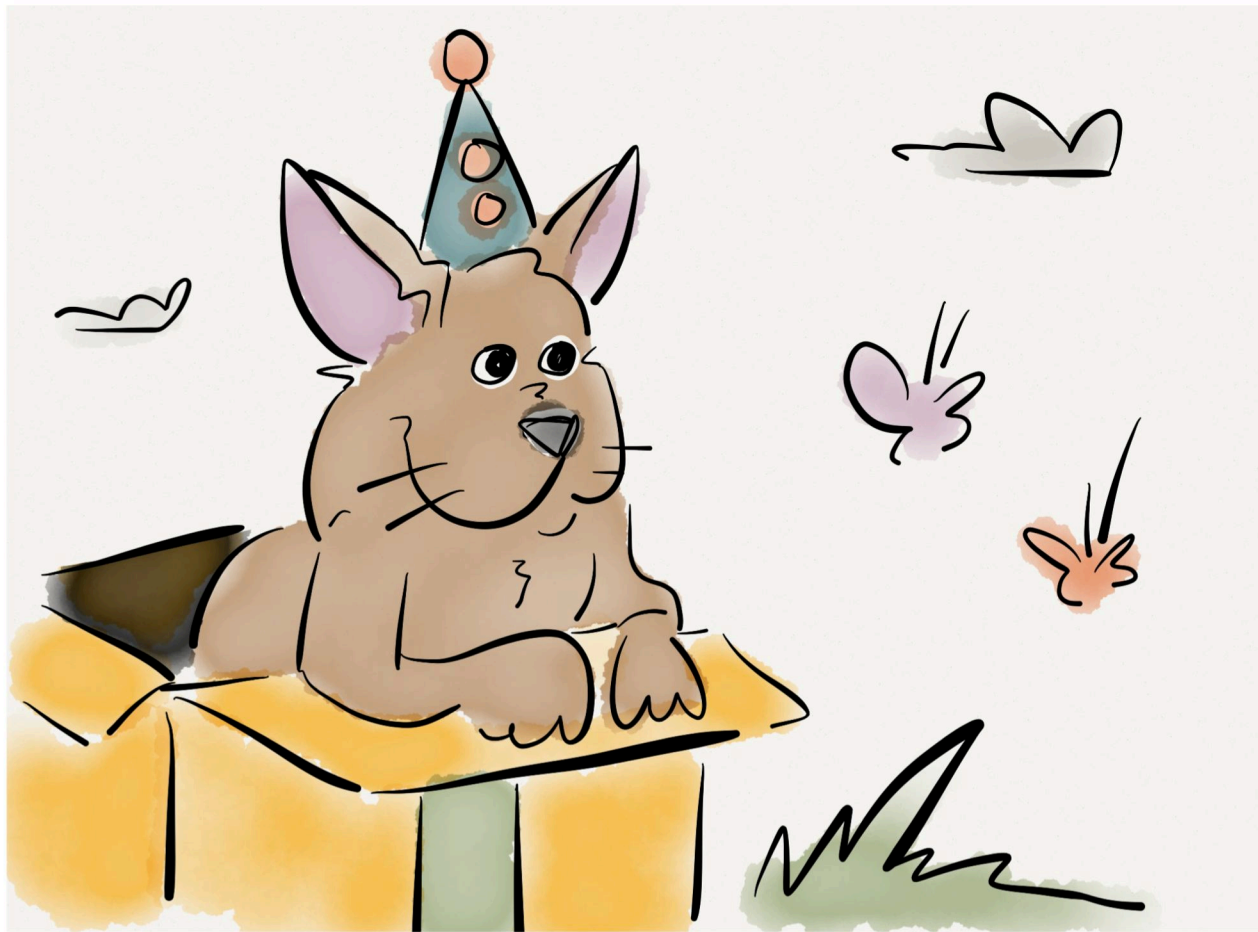
Before Thomas realized he wasn't heavy enough to hold the balloon by himself he was already too high up to let go.



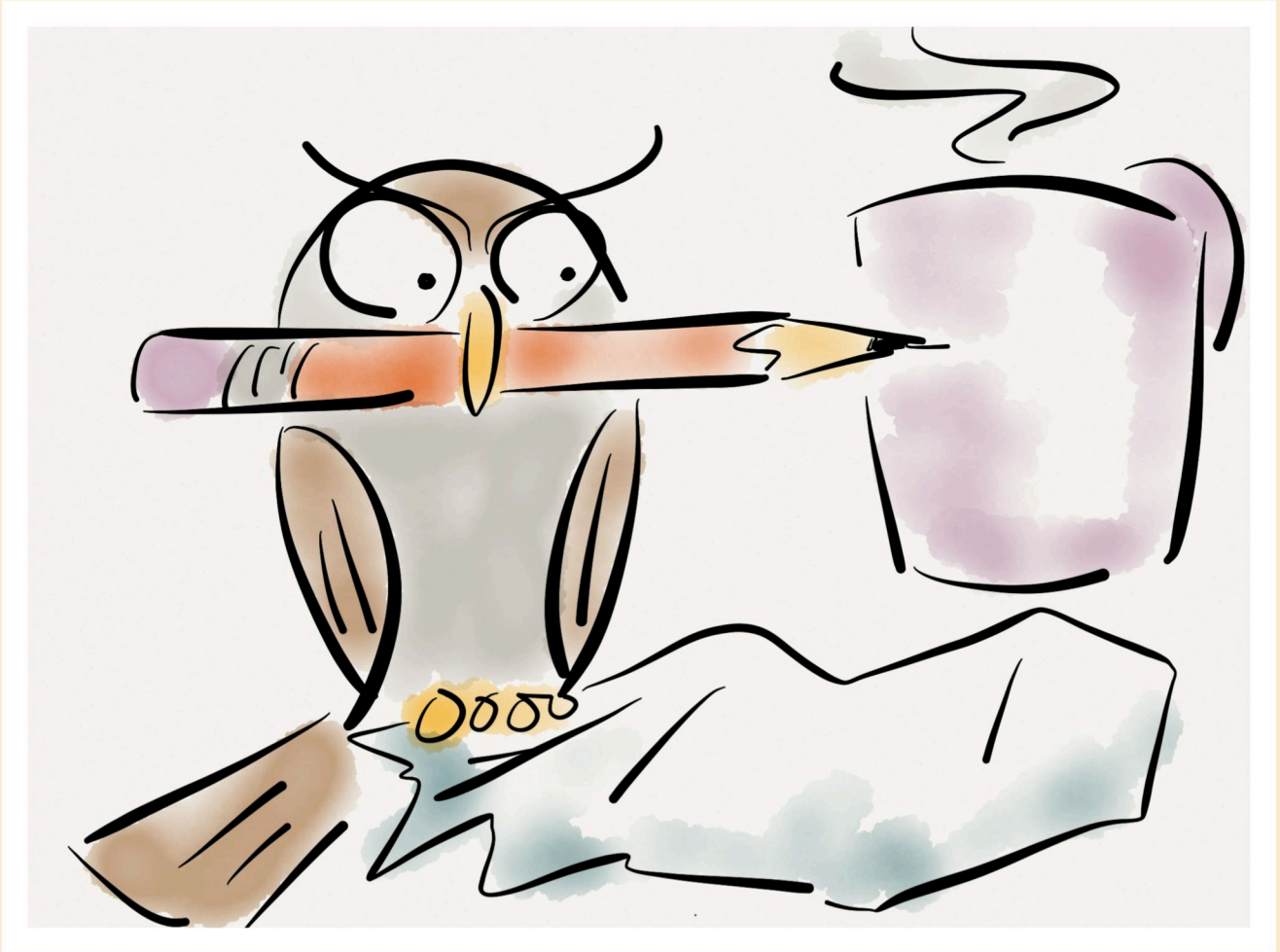
If you ask then nicely, an elephant will paint a picture of you for your birthday.
